There will be more or less daily homework, three tests and a final exam. The homework will count as one test and the final will count as two tests, making six "tests" in all. Those six scores will be averaged; an average of at least 90 will get an A, at least 80 will get a B, at least 70 will get a C and at least 60 will get a D.

No late homework will be accepted. (Solutions should be appearing shortly after the due date, making late homework problematic.) There will be no make-up exams given except in case of a documented medical emergency. Note that football games and weddings are not medical emergencies.

The homework will be online, using WebAssign. See the next page for details on that. Note that you need to get up and running on WebAssign immediately; the first homework is due at 6:00 AM on Thursday of the first week of class.

There will be no calculators (also no iPods, etc.) on tests. You *will* need a calculator for a small percentage of the homework problems; if you don't have a calculator you can borrow one for the semester at the department office, MS 401.

You can ask questions in class. You can ask me about calculus or anything else in my office, during office hours or by appointment. You can also get help at the MLRC, on the fourth floor of the Classroom Building.

WebAssign

Note first that you can find a variety of helpful material regarding the technical details of setting up and using WebAssign at <http://www.math.okstate.edu/webassign>

The nice people at the MLRC may also be helpful here, since most of them have used WebAssign in the past.

First you need to have a WebAssign account. If you took the OSU calculus readiness test you already have an account; your username is your (short) OKey username and your password is your OKey password (or rather, whatever that password was when you took the test). If you don't already have an account you need to create one; please use your short OKey username as username. (See below for hints on how to find your OKey username if you don't know what it is.)
