**Examinations:** There will be three hour examination with a maximum possible score of 100 points each and a 200 point comprehensive final examination. **Tentative** hour exam dates are Feb. 16, Mar. 15, and Apr. 19 and the final exam will be given at 2pm on Tuesday, May 1. If it improves your grade, the percentage score on the Final exam will be used to replace a low examination score. **Make-up** examinations for full credit will be given only for very serious and unavoidable conflicts, and only if you notify me in advance.

**Quiz Score:** Homework will be assigned for practice. To encourage you to do the practice problems in a timely manner they will be tested by pop quizzes. There will be no make-ups for quizzes but the low quiz score will be dropped. The number of quizzes to be given is not determined. The quiz score will be calculated as  $(\text{your total}) / (2(\text{total possible} - 10))$ .

**Academic Dishonesty/Misconduct:** Academic dishonesty is behavior in which a deliberately fraudulent misrepresentation is employed in an attempt to gain undeserved intellectual credit, either by one's self or for another. Academic dishonesty is not condoned or tolerated at OSU.
